Is your Hearing Aid Battery dead?

Ever wonder if your hearing aid battery is dead? Several weeks ago a client showed me a really neat trick to find out. Here's what you do:

Hold the hearing aid battery about six to eight inches above a hard and flat surface, like your kitchen table, countertop or your desk and simply drop the battery. If it bounces around like a jumping bean it is out of juice, if it just kind of goes thud and doesn't bounce, it's fresh! Simple as that.
