Why is my hearing aid whistling?

Hearing aids have microphones and receivers (speakers), among other parts of course. Anytime the sound coming out of the receiver (speaker) gets picked up again by the microphones it creates feedback and usually sounds like a high pitch whistling sound.

Hearing aids will often whistle if you take it out of your ear and forget to turn it off, which is perfectly normal. However, sometimes the hearing aid will do this while you're wearing it but don't worry, this is not something you need to put up with. If your hearing aid whistles while you're wearing it, it means that sound is escaping from your ear and being picked up again by the microphones. Sometimes this means that your hearing aid needs to be cleaned, other times it might have means you obstruction in your ear canal, or other times it just needs a minor adjustment.
